

### 13. Plage de L'Aber

15 miles about 22 mins

We think Plage de L'aber is our favourite beach on the Crozon. There are 3 different parking areas giving onto entirely different parts of the beach each with different characters. There are no facilities here at all, so its not for everyone. Take a picnic etc.



This photo was taken from near the car park at the northwestern end of the beach, which leads straight onto the beach proper. Behind the beach are sand dunes which lead onto a salt-marsh great for bird watchers.

The centre car park is where the tidal area is separated from the beach with a small stream, another popular place for birdwatching. From this parking area you can walk down a track to the sea but would have to wade across the stream at low water to reach the main beach!

Small boats use the stream to gain access to safe moorings.

The third parking area is on the headland separating 2 beaches, close to the headland behind the cottage in the picture below; this gives access to a beautiful part of the coast. The first island can be accessed at low water where you will find the remains of an old Napoleonic fort built to protect Morgat from marauding English ships. Watch the tide or you will be wading back!
